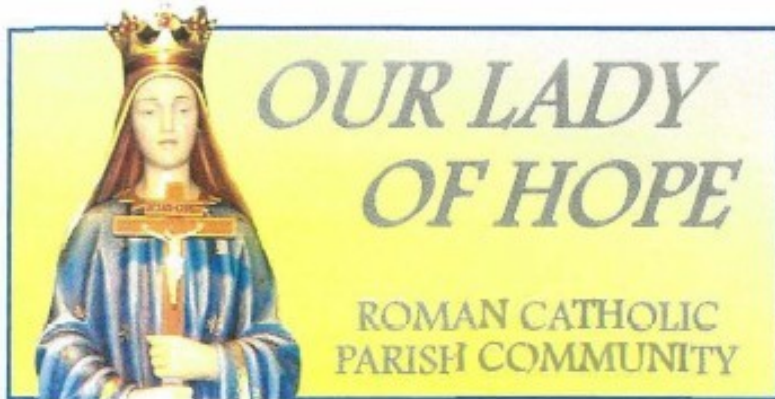

TWENTY-NINTH ORDINARY

SUNDAY The persistence needed to constantly turn toward God with faith is best achieved in community. Even the widow's pleading was a public spectacle. We can each strengthen our faith by leaning on each other instead of trying to carry our burdens alone. Jesus promises a just response to our petitions. By presenting our prayers within the context of community, we can better ensure that our requests align with God's vision of justice: that all humanity be reconciled in right relationship with each other and with God. The unnamed widow in today's Gospel repeatedly approaches the unjust judge. She is persistent in her demand for justice. The widow is "an icon for what it means to do the work of justice."

A MESSAGE FROM POPE LEO XIV "The Gospel announces to us that everyone's life can change because Christ rose from the dead. This event is the truth that saves us; therefore, it must be known and proclaimed. But that is not enough; it must be loved. It is love that leads us to understand the Gospel, for love transforms us by opening our hearts to the word of God and to the face of our neighbor."
