THIRD SUNDAY OF THE EASTER SEASON: Jesus' conversation with Peter today is indeed a model of restoration

after Peter was disloyal to Jesus, His approach is not one of punishment or scolding. How can this model shape the way parents approach their children after wrongdoing? Like the apostles in the first reading, there are times when our conscience calls us to act in ways contrary to the law or to orders from our superiors. One example: organizations providing humanitarian help to migrants crossing the border. Let us maintain fidelity to the Gospel as our first and foremost loyalty. The Church gave us *fifty days* to think carefully how the Lord draws us close, feeds us, and empowers us to be living witnesses of joy. us, and empowers us to be living witnesses of joy. Put yourself in the shoes of the early Christians by reading all the Acts of the Apostles. Look for an opportunity to feed the hungry this week. Be aware of people who need a conversation about their faith and be ready to listen to them.
